LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Occupational Health and Safety Act—Section 25,26,27 & 28 Regulation 213—Section 21,26 CSA Standard Z259 Ministry Of Labour's Working At Heights Training Program Standard Who should attend?

All learners who have previously completed an approved Working at Heights training course and who wish to maintain its validity need successfully complete a refresher training course.

FAQ'S

Q- Is this training mandatory? A– Yes, it is part of a new Ministry of Labour Standard of Training.

Q- Who has to have this training?

A– Any person who works at heights is required to have this training. The MOL is focusing on those in the construction industry at this time, but intend to expand the enforcement of the new Working At Height Standard (WAH) to other business sectors.

Q– How do I know if a training provider is approved by the MOL? A– A list of authorized training providers is available on the MOL website: https://www.labour.gov.on.ca/english/hs/wah_providers.php

Q– How long is the course?

A– The Working at Heights Training Program Standard sets out the minimum duration of the learning outcomes comprising the refresher training components (section 9.2 learning outcomes) to be 3.5 hours in length. In addition, it must also include successful completion of a written test and practical demonstration, as per section 10 in the Working at Heights Training Program Standard.

Q– What if I have already taken a Fall Arrest Course. Is that still good?
A– Effective October 1st, 2017 you MUST have a valid Working At Heights certificate issued by a Ministry of Labour Approved Training Provider in order to work at heights in construction.
